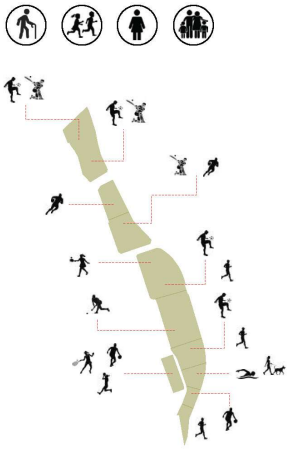

KEY PRINCIPLES TO GUIDE PROPOSED ACTIONS AND INTERVENTIONS

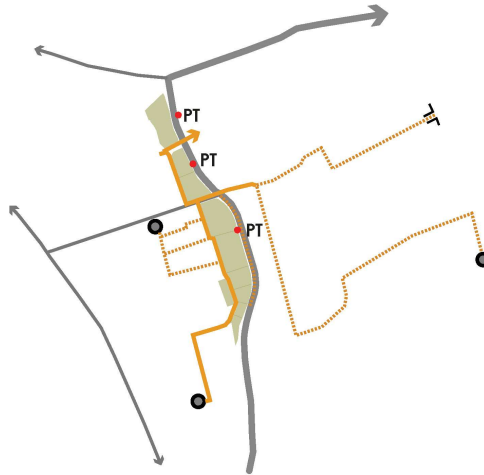
INCLUSIVITY



The site currently caters for a limited number of sporting codes and users. Going forward the site must offer a wider range of sporting and recreational activities catering to a wide range of people including those of different ages, women and those with disabilities as far as possible.



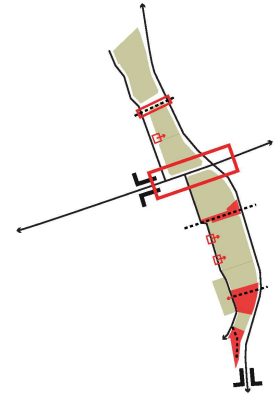
CONNECTIVITY



Promote and support accessibility by a range of people and communities through the provision of public transport infrastructure, the provision of stop and drops on Liesbeek Parkway and the provision of improved infrastructure in support of non-motorised transport linkages across, along and through the site.



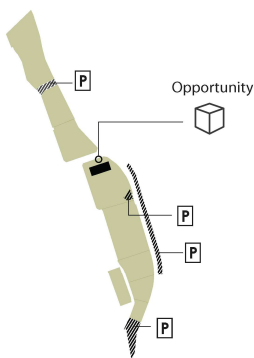
LEGIBILITY



Provide visual clues and set up a hierarchy of spaces, gateways and cross routes that help to provide clarity on where activities are located and how to move around the site to take best advantage of what it has to offer.



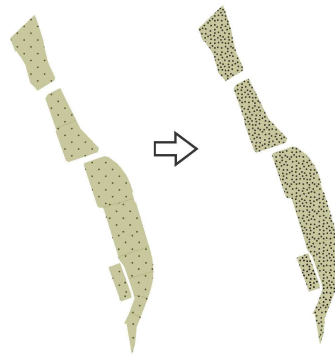
SELF SUFFICIENCY



The site requires capital and operational expenditure for management and maintenance. Income generating facilities could be considered as a way to support and reinforce sports and recreational activities. A comprehensive management model would be developed to guide and facilitate this, in the public interest.



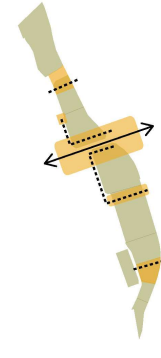
INTENSIFICATION



Intensify the use of the HSP to promote the efficient use of public resources. This principle requires that the site and management thereof, facilitates the planned and coordinated sharing of the fields and facilities on site between codes, clubs and other users.



ACTIVATION



Frame public routes with land use activities that offer "eyes over the space" and service the needs of users and people passing through. Security offices, kiosks and spaces for food trucks etc. are some of the land uses which can be considered appropriate to edge the public pedestrian spaces and routes.
